


The redeveloped ballpark was well received and appreciated, creating a special atmosphere across the weekend, especially on the Friday and Saturday nights.

MATCH PREVIEW & SERIES REVIEW

The Alcohol. Think Again Perth Heat are back to Harley-Davidson Perth's Ballpark this week to take on Geelong-Korea full of confidence on the back by two big wins over Melbourne capped by a Robbie Glendinning grand slam.

Three rounds into the 2019/20 ABL season and the Heat are just percentage behind Melbourne Aces for first place in the Southwest Division with an identical 8-4 record ahead of this week's series against division opponent Geelong-Korea.

The series gets underway on Thursday night from 7pm with the same start time as well on Friday and Saturday nights before it wraps up on Sunday from 4pm.

The Heat opened the season by claiming 3-1 series victories away to Auckland Tuatara and at home to Canberra Cavalry before splitting the series with the Melbourne Aces last week,

With three series under their belt, the Heat have shown some great performances from both the pitchers and the batters.

On the hill, our arms have only given up a league-low 37 runs after 12 games. Dylan Unsworth, John Anderson and Conor Lourey are the starters that manager Brooke Knight has trusted with starting Games 1, 2 and 3 in each series.

The Heat's bullpen is also one of the best in the league, featuring the 'unhittable' Carlos Garcia. The Dominican has not given up a run in his three outings while recording 11 strikeouts.


At the plate, our hitters can also do some damage in the box. Last weekend Robbie Glendinning hit a crucial grand slam in the series finale against the Melbourne Aces in a game-winner on Sunday. The star bat has already smashed three home runs and 15 hits this season.

Rays prospect Kaleo Johnson and Jordan Qsar have also impressed. Johnson leads the team with 16 hits while Qsar's eight-hit-series against Canberra made him a fan-favourite.

This will be Geelong-Korea's second visit to Perth having traveled west in the 2018/19 season. The Heat won the series 3-1 including a crazy 19-1 victory. But this year, Geelong's roster has been complemented by several KBO-affiliated talents.

That includes 35-year-old Kyun-Eun Noh as the biggest star on the team with more than 280 KBO appearances. Noh has also begun the season in style and is the team's No. 1 pitcher.

Noh will need strong support from the bullpen this weekend. The visitors have dropped 90 runs in three rounds and will be wary of the Heat's power hitters.

ROBBIE GLENDINNING

He is the reigning ABL Rookie of the Year and Robbie Glendinning has started 2019/20 in dazzling form including a stunning grand slam home run to close last week's series in Melbourne against the Aces.

The 24-year-old Perth local delivered a standout 2018/19 campaign with the Heat consisting of batting at an average of .326 on top of hitting three home runs to go with 15 hits from 46 at bats along with batting in 14 runs.

It was quite the impressive performance from Glendinning even though he made just the 12 appearances before heading back to the United States splitting his time between the AA's Altoona Curve and the A+ Bradenton Marauders.

With Altoona, he played 58 games for an average of .261 to go with 48 hits, five home runs and 31 runs batted in and at Bradenton, he was even more impressive going at .340 along with 55 hits, eight homers and 26 runs batted in.

Even though his time in America ended prematurely due to an ankle injury, that allowed him to get himself fit and firing for the 2019/20 season with the Heat, and to say it's paying off would be one of the great understatements.

Glendinning looks every bit the player now entering the prime of his career, going from exciting rookie to a player ready to really make his mark on Australian baseball much to the benefit of the Heat.

Already in the opening 12 games of which the Heat sit at 8-4 following 3-1 series wins against the Auckland Tuatara and Canberra Cavalry, and 2-2 split with Melbourne Aces, Glendinning has been brilliant.

He has 15 hits to his credit already from 46 at bats which has included six doubles, 14 runs batted in and then the three massive home runs.

There were none better or more important than on Sunday in Melbourne. With bases loaded, Glendinning delivered a stunning home run at Melbourne Ballpark to send in the winning four runs for the Heat as they prepared to head home to take on Geelong-Korea this week.


For Glendinning, any home run feels good and he hopes he can continue his stunning start to the season.

"Every time you hit a home run it's a great feeling. I was just fortunate to put bat on the ball well and hopefully a few more get out," Glendinning said.

"It has been a good start for the boys. Hopefully we can carry it on and there's more where that came from."

I think the Heat will win it all this season. We got a great list and with the 7 players coming in from Tampa we are going to have a great list that will finally end Brisbane's dominance.





OUR OPPONENTS

GEELONG KOREA

Geelong Korea is one of two expansion teams new to the ABL last year. They finished fourth in the Southwest Division with a 7-33 record in their inaugural season. This season, their roster features both experienced veteran and young talent from South Korea, which may help them achieve a better result.

35-year old pitcher Kyung-Eun Noh has played 328 KBO games over 14 seasons. He is a household name in South Korea and the ace of Geelong. Infielder Ji-Hwan Bae is another key player to watch. He played for the minor league team of Pittsburgh Pirates this year, recording 106 hits throughout the season.

Geelong Korea's manager Graeme Lloyd is a legend of Australian baseball. He has won two World-Series with the New York Yankees and represented the silver-medal-winning Team Australia in the 2004 Olympic Games. Lloyd has also been the pitching coach of Perth Heat alongside head coach Brooke Knight and led the team to four ABL titles.

Geelong opens the season with three straight wins against Sydney Blue Sox, but lost 7 of last 9 games including a series sweep at Brisbane. Pitching has been the weakness of Geelong as they have given up a league-highest 90 runs in the first three rounds.
